**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SELL  
A POLICE MOTORCYCLE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, The Village owns a police motorcycle that it no longer needs and now desires to sell; and,

WHEREAS, It is in the best interests of the Village to sell the police motorcycle as it is presently being under-utilized and counter productive for the needs of the Village at this time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Boston Heights, County of Summit, State of Ohio as follows:

Section 1: That it is in the best interests of the Village of Boston Heights and its operations to sell its police motorcycle.


Section 2: That the Mayor and Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized and directed to sell the police motorcycle in a reasonably commercial fashion. The motorcycle shall not be sold for an amount less than \$12,000.

Section 3: That the Mayor is authorized entered into a written contract with the highest and best bidder after an advertisement for an amount less than two or more than four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village. The Mayor may also advertise in other locations. Internet auction of the motorcycle is permitted if the Mayor determines that it is in the best interest of the Village to sell the motorcycle by way of the internet. Such an auction shall not be less than ten (10) calendar days, including Saturdays, Sundays, and any holidays. The Mayor may contract with a specific auction representative, whose identity is not yet presently known. If the Mayor elects to sell the motorcycle by way of internet auction, advertising for the internet auction is hereby directed and shall be accomplished in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code on this topic.


Section 4: That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with the applicable legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety of the Village residents and to allow for the continued operations of the Village Police Department and other departments and shall therefore take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.
